
# The District Rotary Foundation Committee

### Global Grants


- Global Grants are larger, sustainable, multi-year projects in area of focus and coordinated by clubs in two different countries.


## **Building Entrepreneurship in Ventura and Santa Barbara Counties**

### Global Grants – Funding Example

Clubs in District 5240 Cash Contribution -- \$20,000
District 5240 DDF Match (100% of Cash) -- \$20,000
World Fund Match (80% of DDF) -- \$16,000
Global Grant Funding -- \$56,000
Cash Required (with 5% surcharge) -- \$21,000

 Non-sponsoring clubs supporting a global grant must complete a cash contribution form signed by the club president that will accompany the grant application



### The lifecycle of a Rotary grant



#### **Draft**

Rotary members plan a project or scholarship and build their grant application online

#### **Authorization**

Club and district leaders review the application and authorize funding

#### **Submitted**


The grant's planners submit the application to The Rotary Foundation


#### Approved

If the grant is approved, the Foundation issues payment

#### Completion

Members carry out the project, reporting to the Foundation annually until the work or studies are finished and the grant is closed

# District Charitable Foundation Travel Grants

- Subsize the travel costs of Rotarians from Rotary clubs in District 5240 traveling to develop and/or support international humanitarian projects.
- **B** Up to \$750 for one traveler or up to \$1500 for two or three travelers
- Must be matched by cash
- Guidelines and applications are available on the District 5240 website



# What You Should Do Now 2023-2024 Global Grants

- Notify the Global Grants committee if you are planning to submit a Global Grant in 2023-24
- Comply with the District 5240 Global Grant Policies available on the district website
- Request assistance as needed from the Global Grants committee during the preparation of the grant application



# What You Should Do Now 2024-2025 District Grants

- Ensure that your club is qualified
  - The club president-elect and one other knowledgeable member of the club must attend a grant management seminar
  - The current club president and president-elect must sign the TRF MOU
  - If you club is incorporated, approve a board resolution to adopt the TRF MOU and have it signed by the club president and club treasurer
  - Submit the signed MOU and club resolution to the district stewardship chair (<a href="mailto:davcgor@gmail.com">davcgor@gmail.com</a>)



# What You Should Do Now 2024-2025 Global Grants

- If you are going to be the club lead on a global grant, attend a grant management seminar
- Plan to attend Global Grant training at the District 5240 Training Assembly
- Meet with members of the Global Grants committee to discuss your proposed project
